Some Deeper Aspects of Masonic Symbolism

Living Stones

The Candidate is instructed to work towards his own perfection under the light of Masonry. There is no mystery, no concealment whatever, and it calls for no research in respect of its source. Its analogies and replicas are everywhere, more especially in religious systems. It is a reflection of the Pauline doctrine that man is or may become a temple of the Holy Spirit. But it should be observed in this connection that there is a rather important though confusing mixture of images in the address of the Worshipful Master to the Candidate,

after the latter has been invested and brought to the East. It is pointed out to him that he represents the cornerstone of a building – as it might be, the whole Masonic edifice but he is immediately counselled to raise a superstructure from the foundation of that corner-stone – thus reversing the image. That of the corner-stone is like an externalization in dramatic form of an old Rosicrucian maxim belonging to the year 1629: – "Be ye transmuted from dead stones into living, philosophical stones."

... it is the more important side of the symbolism; it is as if the great Masonic edifice were to be raised on each Candidate; and if every Neophyte shaped his future course both in and out of Masonry, as though this were the case actually, I feel that the Royal Art would be other than it now is and that our individual lives would differ.

Masonry has for its object, under one aspect, the building of the Candidate as a house or temple of life. Degrees outside the Craft aspire to this building as a living stone in a spiritual temple, meet for God's service.

Brethren all,

The Third Masonic District has resumed scheduling annual Ladies Night and Anniversary Banquets. It has been some time since Lodges have done these banquets, so I wanted to use the newsletter to identify some of the key things you should be thinking about as you prepare for and conduct your Lodge banquet. Much of the guidance in this article comes from the Protocol Manual for the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, which also serves as a guide for local Lodge banquets.

Worshipful Masters should ensure written invitations go to all who are officially expected to attend. Please make sure the invitation includes the date for the response. If you don't receive a response shortly after it is due, give the invitee a call. For all Brethren, please respond to the invitation by the response date to ensure the host Lodge can fully prepare for evening and avoid any surprises (like not enough seats or food).

Lodge officers should wear Masonic dress for the banquet. A short, or tuxedo coat is acceptable but not required. All other Brethren should be in coat and tie.

Ensure the room for the banquet is properly set up. Seating for the head table should follow the guidance provided in the Leadership Training Handbook provided to Worshipful Masters and Wardens (avoid ladies at the end of the table). There should be an American Flag, a podium, a gavel (use it for all standing and being seated to include introduction of the DDGM), and if at all possible, a podium. If a sound system or other audiovisual equipment is used, **MAKE SURE IT WORKS** before the start of the banquet.

You should have a written program. Most Lodges have a history of banquet programs to use as examples. If you need an example program, please notify one of the SOI Principals. Historically, the program begins with a welcome, Pledge of Allegiance, invocation, and introduction of the head table and guests prior to dinner. After dinner, the program should include introduction of past masters, spouses of deceased Brethren, introduction of officers and introduction of visiting Worshipful Masters. The Worshipful Master usually introduces visiting WMs, and other officers introduce Past Masters, spouses of deceased Brethren and Lodge officers. I recommend that officers making the introductions make sure they know who is present for introducing PMs, and when introducing Lodge officers, know which ones are present and acknowledge those who were unable to attend. Officers introducing spouses of departed brethren should also know which of those invited are present. Make sure you know how to pronounce their names and if possible, introduce yourself to them before the banquet starts.

Some Lodges present awards at annual banquets and these should be given prior to the entertainment. It is customary for entertainment to be provided prior to remarks by the DDGM (or RWGM if present) if possible. The Grand Lodge Protocol Guide states that remarks by the DDGM (or RWGM if present) should be the last thing done prior to the benediction.

I hope we are all excited about resuming the tradition of annual Lodge banquets. Good luck with your banquet preparation and don't hesitate to contact the SOI if you need additional assistance.

The best ideas are those that work and the best scholars are leaders who set the pace for putting their thoughts and knowledge into action.

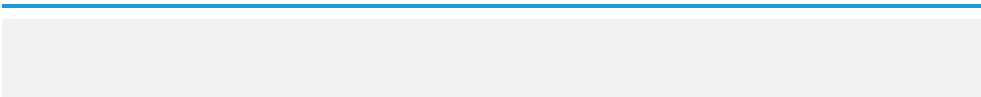

The Pennsylvania Lodge of Research is a unique occurrence in the history of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, as this is the first Lodge constituted within our Jurisdiction solely for the purpose of Masonic study.

Meetings

The Pennsylvania Lodge of Research holds only two Stated Meetings each year, with Special Meetings to be held at the discretion of the Worshipful Master. Meetings are held at various Masonic sites throughout the Commonwealth. No Craft Degrees are conferred. The elected Worshipful Master does not receive “the Word of the Chair,” nor does he become a voting member of the Grand Lodge.

Programs

Information about the Craft in general is shared, and at least two research papers are presented, followed by discussion. Of course, good fellowship is also essential to the success of the Lodge of Research!

The Annual Meeting is held late in the year, at which the election and installation of officers is held. All Master Masons are welcome to attend.

Anyone, by invitation of the Master, may present. Brethren interested in submitting papers for possible presentation at future meetings of the Pennsylvania Lodge of Research, or who have Masonic queries they would like answered, should submit them to the Secretary.
