Famous Examples of Men Made a Mason "At Sight"

Ill. John Glenn, 33°

In 1978, the Grand Master of Ohio made Glenn a Mason at sight, raising him to the degree of Master Mason. Due to his celebrity status as a Senator and astronaut, the ceremony was a significant event that saw hundreds of Masons attend. Bro. Glenn went on to receive the Scottish Rite degrees in the Valley of Cincinnati and was named Sovereign Grand Inspector General and became a 33rd degree Scottish Rite Mason, Honorary Member of the Supreme Council.



President William Howard Taft

Taft became a Mason within weeks of his inauguration as President in 1909. The Grand Master of Ohio convened an Occasional Lodge at the Scottish Rite Cathedral in Cincinnati, and 14 Grand Masters of other jurisdictions were in attendance. Given that Taft was President-elect at the time, 800 people attended the ceremony, and more than 2,000 were turned away. Taft went on to petition and join Kilwinning Lodge No. 356, the same lodge where his father and brothers were members.

There is no question that to this day, one of the biggest allures of Freemasonry is the long line of famous leaders and influential figures of history that have found their way into our ranks. Calling these noble men "Brother" is one of the true honors of being a Mason. Several of our most inspiring brethren were made Masons "at sight" in their day, as typically a Mason "at sight" is reserved for someone of high regard or otherwise a pillar of society.

How well you use these tools in your pursuit of Masonic knowledge will be analyzed and determined through your Evaluation Reports. Why do brethren not pass between the Altar and the East when lodge is at labor?



Brethren do not pass between the Altar and the East in a Masonic lodge at labor (except in a degree) because the Master is supposed to have the Great Lights constantly in view. In theory, at least, he draws inspiration from the Altar to preside over the lodge and must not, therefore, be prevented from seeing it at any time.

The custom is but a pretty courtesy, but it is rooted in a fundamental conception of the Craft that the Altar is

the center of Masonry, and that from it and from the Great Lights it bears, flow all that there is of Masonic inspiration and truth and light.

English lodges do not have this problem, since in them a pedestal near the Master is the Altar on which lies the Holy Book.

The elected Worshipful Master does not receive "the Word of the Chair," nor does he become a voting member of the Grand Lodge.

The medallion of the Pennsylvania Lodge of Research depicts a classical female allegorical figure holding a manuscript in one hand and a square and compasses in the other. The sunburst represents Enlightenment. Its symbolism is obvious in depicting the purposes of the Lodge of Research as sharing Masonic Light with others who are following a planned approach to personal character-building and self-improvement, and to encourage an organized process of formal education of the Craft at large.
