Brethren all,

If you haven't done it already, November is the time for planning the transition to the next Masonic year. In addition to the necessary certifications and a mastery of the work required in new places and stations in the Lodge, it is time to think seriously about election and installation of officers. The SOI work of the evening for November 20th is the Election and Installation of Officers by Big Spring Lodge No. 361.

I am assuming that most Lodges will elect officers by voice vote. We will focus on the closed election and installation for this school session but will be prepared to discuss the differences for the Open Installation for Lodge Officers. The ritual for voice vote election can be found on page 45 of the *Worshipful Master's Handbook* (latest edition that I have is 2018-2019). Following the election by voice vote, proceed with the installation. There is a note in the *Ritual Manual* following the section on Election of

Officers that says:

The election ceremony is now concluded and installation can begin. Please contact the Principal of Your School of Instruction or Regional Instructor for the specific procedures involved with this ceremony.

While the Open Installation of officers is clearly described in the *Ritual Manual*, procedures for the closed installation are not so straightforward. The procedure for a closed installation of officers begins on page 91 of the *Ritual Manual*. This portion of the ritual implies (to me) that the W.M.-elect is installed first, and then installs the remainder of the elected officers. However, I received the following guidance from our Regional Instructor:

Either the current W.M. may install the officers, or he may direct another to do so. For instance, he may direct each outgoing officer to install his replacement. It is also up to the lodge as to the order to install, descending (WM, SW, JW, Treas, Sec) or ascending (Sec, Treas, JW, SW, WM).


We will discuss these "specific procedures" at SOI.


Lastly, please remember that in the open installation, the Brother being installed "recites" his obligation. In the closed installation, the installing officer "administers" the obligation to the officer being installed. In all cases, the installing officer must do the investiture of regalia and documents. I bring this up because there is some ritual that must be committed to memory for installation. Don't wait too long to get started on this.

Brethren, I look forward to seeing you at SOI to make sure our elections and installations properly honor those taking new offices in the Lodge.






