The Tyler

The Tyler's job in Freemasonry is to serve as the Outer Guard of the lodge, guarding the door from the outside with a drawn sword to ensure that only qualified, initiated members enter the meeting. Their duties include guarding against "cowans and intruders," checking visitors' credentials and regalia, greeting latecomers, and symbolically protecting the lodge's secrets and harmony. The term "Tyler" originates from the operative stonemasons who would cover the roof of a building with tiles, and in the speculative sense, the Tyler "covers" or conceals the lodge's interior

Key Responsibilities:

Guarding the Entrance:

The Tyler sits outside the door of the lodge, ready to refuse entry to anyone not qualified to enter.

Verifying Credentials:

They ensure that visitors are properly dressed (wearing their Masonic regalia), have the correct endorsements, and are signed into the visitor's book.

Maintaining Security:

The Tyler is the first line of defense against eavesdroppers and uninitiated individuals who might try to infiltrate the lodge.

Symbolic Role:

With a drawn sword that has no scabbard, the Tyler symbolizes the ongoing need to protect the lodge's sacred space and the symbolic boundaries of Freemasonry itself.

Symbolic Title:

The term "Tyler" comes from the Old English word for "roof-tiler," which relates to covering and concealing, just as the Tyler conceals the lodge's interior from unauthorized view.

Assisting Visitors:

The Tyler may also assist in the preparation of candidates and help late-arriving members find their place in the lodge.

The Tyler's Symbol:

The Tyler's jewel is a sword, symbolizing the collective responsibility of Masons to guard their thoughts, words, and deeds, and to remain vigilant against spiritual and physical foes.

Chicken BBQs have been a fun activity for the members, and has also been a good way to raise funds for the lodge building.


The Lodge's Open House saw many community members visibly pass by and take notice of who we are.


