Brethren,

Unfortunately, I was not able to make it, but I understand the venue and the weather were great, the food was great, and the degree was very well done. I also hear that Brother Dan Confer did a great job in his debut doing the Canadian charge – not an easy task! Thanks again to everyone who helped to make this traditional Masonic event a great success.

The work for September's SOI was the funeral service, examination of visitors and balloting. There was some debate during the work on balloting about the floor work for the Senior Deacon after he places the ballot box on the altar, and the dialog on exactly when he votes, and moves to his position at the altar. I am researching this with the regional instructors. I think this is one of those issues which was done differently in different Lodges as a result of multiple changes made to the balloting ritual with changes by Grand Masters. I will notify WMs when I get the definitive answer.

We have adjusted the SOI schedule published in the lodge directory for the remainder of the year to accommodate the new ritual and an added competition during this past year. The remainder of the SOI schedule for the year is:

The work for the October SOI will be the election of officers using the ballot box, which will be required for all Lodges this year. Not many Lodges have used this procedure in the recent past and some not at all. We will cover this ritual in detail at the October SOI. Please plan now to have your Lodge Instructor and elected officers at this meeting so you are prepared for this requirement. Current officers are reminded that there is additional dialog required for electing officers this way. All District Three Lodges will elect officers in November.



For those of you who are not aware, the latest version of the Worshipful Master's Handbook, Version 1, can be found online in Grandview. While this is a book published primarily for WMs, it is an excellent reference for all Brethren, and particularly Lodge officers. It includes a lot of very useful information not available in other documents.

Worshipful Masters are also reminded that for the remainder of this Masonic year, someone other than the WM should present the opening and closing charges at the stated meeting. Any elected or appointed officer (other than a past master) may do this.

Brethren, I look forward to seeing you at the October SOI so you can learn about Election of Officers, using the ballot box.

The Pursuivant



In Freemasonry, a Pursuivant is a junior officer, often associated with the Grand Pursuivant, whose role varies by jurisdiction but typically involves duties such as guarding the door, announcing candidates for admission to meetings, and assisting with the arrangement and care of regalia. The office is not universal in Masonry but is a key role in some jurisdictions, notably in Pennsylvania, where the Pursuivant attends the outer door and escorts members into the lodge. The term is derived from the civilian role of a junior heraldic officer.

Role and Duties

- Announcing and escorting:

The Pursuivant's primary duty is to announce incoming members and escort them into the lodge after their admission.

- Guarding the door:

In some jurisdictions, like Pennsylvania, the Pursuivant attends the outer door to manage entrances and exits.

- Regalia:

The Pursuivant may be responsible for taking charge of the jewels and regalia of the Grand Lodge.

- Ceremonial duties:

The office has ceremonial responsibilities and is a mark of honor and dedication within the fraternity.

Jurisdictional Differences

- Pennsylvania:

The Pursuivant role is particularly important in Pennsylvania, where the officer guards the lodge's outer door.

- United Grand Lodge of England (UGLE):

In some jurisdictions, such as the UGLE, the functions of a Pursuivant are carried out by other officers, like the Junior and Senior Deacons or the Inner Guard.

- Local Level:

While the Grand Pursuivant holds a high position within the Grand Lodge, the Pursuivant office at the local lodge level is generally unknown outside of certain jurisdictions, like Pennsylvania.

Origin of the Term

- The title "Pursuivant" originates from the historical role of a Pursuivant of Arms, a junior officer in a heraldic authority (like England's College of Arms) who performed duties related to heraldry, such as attending to official matters and carrying out escorts.

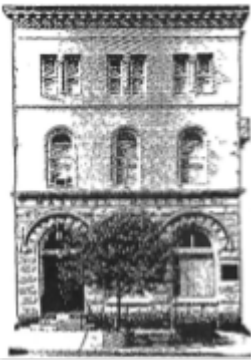

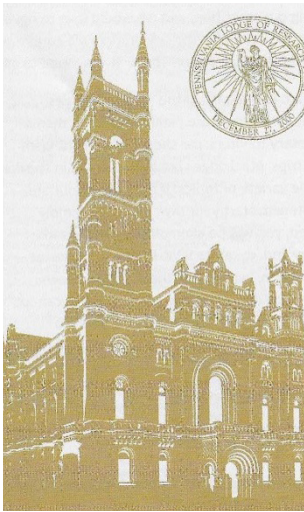
