From the Desk of Brother Timothy C. Dedman

District Deputy Grand Master, Third Masonic District



Brethren of the 3rd Masonic District,

I write this, my first contribution to our District Newsletter, having just returned from the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania and the Open Installation of our new Right Worshipful Grand Master, Brother Robert D. Brink. This gathering also marked the beginning of new terms of office for lodge officers across the Commonwealth. Whether newly installed or continuing in your role, we now begin a new Masonic year with the opportunity to reflect, recalibrate, and recommit ourselves to the work before us.

It is with a full heart and great humility that I begin my service as your District Deputy Grand Master.

Before looking ahead, I wish to extend my sincere thanks to Brother Jeffrey R. Miller, Past District Deputy Grand Master, for his six years of dedicated service to the 3rd Masonic Dis-

trict. His steady leadership and commitment deserve our recognition and gratitude.

As Grand Master Brink begins his term, several changes have already taken effect. I will address these more fully at our next School of Instruction; however, a few require your immediate attention as they directly impact lodge operations.

First, we have returned to the use of a single black ball of dissent on petitions for initiation and membership. It is essential that lodge officers understand both the spirit and the proper handling of this process. A black ball should never be dropped without cause or explanation. Any brother who has concerns regarding a petitioner has a responsibility to voice those concerns to the Committee of Inquiry or to contact me directly so that I may serve as the single dissenting voice if necessary. Lodge officers must also know the correct procedure should a black ball appear. This expectation underscores why I have asked Worshipful Masters to ensure that all three pillar officers and at least one lodge instructor attend each School of Instruction.

Second, it is the intent of the Grand Lodge to discontinue extensions for late dues payments. We will use the remainder of the 2026 dues cycle to clearly reset expectations with our members. Beginning with the 2027 dues year, any member delinquent in dues payment will have his name read at the January stated meeting, with a vote to suspend occurring in February following Due Notice.

For the remainder of the 2026 dues collection, I am requiring that a data sheet be completed for each delinquent member, detailing specific efforts made to contact the brother. This form must be signed by the Membership Chair, Worshipful Master, and Secretary, and submitted to me for approval prior to any vote to suspend for non-payment of dues. As a reminder, a brother who has not paid his 2026 dues is not in good Masonic standing and may not participate in any Masonic activities until his dues are received by the lodge Secretary.

More broadly, I encourage every lodge to reflect on how we engage our members throughout the year—not only at dues time. Each lodge should strive to personally contact every member at least once annually, outside of dues collection, to inquire into his interests, well-being, and any needs he or his family may have. Our Almoner Funds exist for this very purpose and should be used to support our brethren when needed.

Finally, as all prior edicts sunset with the installation of a new Grand Master, the requirement to confer the Entered Apprentice and Fellowcraft Degrees on the same night has been eliminated. Any combined degrees, one-day classes, or similar formats now require a dispensation. Lodges that already have combined degree work scheduled should contact me immediately. Otherwise, this change is effective at once.

In closing, when I became a Freemason, I envisioned a fraternity committed to excellence—one that would challenge me to grow and provide opportunities to become a better man. I am grateful for the brethren who have helped shape my journey, just as each of us continues his own. Growth does not happen by accident. It requires intention, effort, and shared commitment.

My hope is that the lodges of the 3rd Masonic District will strive for excellence in all we do and continue to build lodges where men can learn, grow, and belong. This work will not be accomplished overnight, but I firmly believe it is both achievable and sustainable. I invite you to join me in this endeavor.

From the Desk of Brother Daniel K. Confer, P.M.

Principal, Third Masonic District School of Instruction



Brethren,

I hope you and your families had a wonderful Christmas season and that the New Year brings happiness, well-being and hopefully, prosperity, but certainly contentment.

I want to thank all those who supported the school during the last six years. Given the pandemic, a lot of new ritual, and changing schedules, it was a busy, and often a difficult and frustrating time. But we kept things moving. Most of the credit for that goes to the assistant principals, Brothers Scott Fogle, Dan Confer, Rick Miller and Ed Stenger. These Brothers are the real source of ritual expertise in District Three. I am sure they, along with any new assistant principals appointed, will continue to provide that same ritual expertise to new SOI Principal Brother Dan Confer.

Based on my experience during the last six years, I want to offer a few comments in the spirit of improving the work of the SOI. The SOI is no longer my rodeo, and I am sure you will get more specific guidance from the new DDGM and from Brother Dan. But I want to suggest some "New Year's Resolutions." This is not "official" guidance, but simply my observations based on six years' experience and are aimed primarily at the Lodges.

As originally envisioned, Lodges in the District would be assigned the work for the evening and would then exemplify that work at the SOI. Due to the pandemic, changes to the ritual, or issues within Lodges, fewer and fewer Lodges who came prepared to effectively exemplify the work. The SOI became the place where the exemplifying Lodge looked at the ritual for the first time. That approach required a lot of time and essentially hampered the learning that refines floor work and ritual delivery. I certainly bear some of the responsibility for this.

Although the SOI is now in Brother Dan Confer's care, I want to suggest some "New Year's Resolutions," aimed primarily at the Lodges and their officers.

- One Lodge Instructor for each Lodge should attend SOI each month. This is the best way to make sure the ritual and floor work is consistent across the district, and the word "gets out."
- The Lodge responsible for the work should rehearse before SOI. Each Lodge should ensure that it has sufficient Brethren necessary to fill the chairs needed for the work exemplified. If you need help, coordinate with another Lodge (before the meeting) to get someone.

- If during rehearsal, if there are questions about the ritual being correct, contact the SOI Principal, before the meeting, to get questions answered.
- Ask an SOI Principal to come to your rehearsal.
- Make good ritual a priority in your Lodge.

Brethren, thank you for your support during the past six years. I look forward to sitting with you on the sidelines during SOI.

A Series In Masonic Education

Role of the Junior Master of Ceremonies



In Pennsylvania Freemasonry, the Junior Master of Ceremonies (JMC) is a distinct appointed officer with unique duties, primarily managing the Preparing-Room door, attending to candidates' needs, answering alarms at that door, and assisting with the Opening/Closing and ceremonial aspects during degrees, especially for the Entered Apprentice (EA) degree, distinguishing PA's ritual. They work alongside the Senior Master of Ceremonies (SMC) and are key to the specific "Ancient" ritualistic practices of the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania.

Key Duties of the JMC in PA:

- Door Management: Controls the Preparing-Room door, answering alarms and admitting candidates/members as directed.
- Candidate Preparation: Assists the Senior Master of Ceremonies in preparing candidates for degrees, particularly the EA degree.
 - Ceremonial Role: Participates in the display of swords and other unique ceremonial actions during the EA degree.
 - Logistical Support: May bring attendance slips to the Secretary and generally helps facilitate the flow of the lodge meeting.

How it Differs (PA vs. Other Jurisdictions):

- Pennsylvania has three "rooms" (Preparing, Middle, and Outer) for degree work, unlike many other jurisdictions.
- The JMC's role is much more active and ritualistic in PA compared to other places where the SMC and JMC might only handle candidate prep.

In essence, the JMC is a crucial, hands-on officer for managing the preparatory phase and ensuring the smooth execution of degrees, reflecting Pennsylvania's unique Masonic tradition.




