Brethren,

I hope everyone had a safe and enjoyable Thanksgiving and plenty of time to spend with family and friends. It is a great time of year, not only because it begins what is traditionally our “holiday season,” but for us as Freemasons, we do our annual rituals (elections and installations) and prepare ourselves for the excitement of the upcoming Masonic year.

Based on the comments we received at the November SOI, I assume that all went well with the election of officers using the ballot box. I realize that many of you had never seen an election done this way, so this was probably a good experience for expanding your Masonic ritual knowledge. It remains to be seen how often it will be used in the future.

Along that line, December 27th in the odd years has historically been a time of change in the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania. Incoming Grand Masters often make changes in the ritual and other procedures through the publishing of “edicts” directing these actions (conferring the EA and FC degrees consecutively was an example). This new guidance is generally not released until the day the new Grand Master is installed. I have learned over the years not to be surprised as the new Grand Master introduces his changes. Brother Dan Confer, the incoming SOI principal, and his assistants will be ready to help with any changes as they are published.

At the SOI on November 24th, we focused on the open installation now required in all Lodges. Hopefully, you were able to get all questions answered and are ready for the installation. Since this is one of the few times non-Masons get to see Masonic ritual, it is important that you make a special effort to have the ritual well-hearsed. Pay attention to the details. Is all the regalia in the right place? Do you know when and where Masonic clothing is removed? Do you know how to properly present regalia and other documents and tools? Do you know the correct way to turn when escorting a new officer to his station? These are details you need to rehearse to be fully ready for a well-done installation. If you would like to have a principal attend your Lodge rehearsal for installation of officers, please let one of us know as soon as possible and we will make every effort to have someone attend.

At the December 22nd SOI, we will do the Business of the Lodge. The intent of this session is for new WMs and officers for the upcoming Masonic year to review BOL and to make sure you are ready for that first Lodge meeting in January. For those new WMs and incoming officers, particularly the WM, SW, JW, Secretary, SD and Pursuivant, please make a special effort to attend this meeting. I will be contacting current WMs and asking for their assistance in appointing officers to specific stations and places for this meeting. Incoming officers should review this ritual before SOI to make sure you don't have any questions that we could answer in this session. We will pay particular attention to receiving and voting on petitions and the reception of the DDGM. Again, our hope is that this session will get all new officers off to a great start for next year.

Lastly, Brethren, I wish you and your families a wonderful Holiday Season and a Happy New Year

A Series In Masonic Education

History & Purpose of the St. John's Day Banquet



In Freemasonry, our two patron saints are St. John the Baptist, and St. John the Evangelist; the latter of whom is celebrated with this evening's festivities. Originally, a banquet was held for each of the Saints Johns annually. St. John the Baptist day is celebrated on the summer solstice, June 24. On June 24, 1717, the first recorded St. John's Day Banquet was to celebrate the formation of the Grand Lodge of England and the installation of its first Grand Master. It was at this time Freemasonry become known to the world. There was a great feast, now known as the Feast of Holy Saint John, on this occasion.

St. John the Evangelist is less known than St. John the Baptist, but is written about in the New Testament under the names John the Epistle, John the Divine of Patmos, and as disciple of Jesus. He is also thought to have authored the book of Revelation. The feast of St. John the Evangelist was held on the winter solstice originally, but moved to its current date of December 27. St. John the Evangelist is believed to be a Patron Saint of Freemasonry, because he wrote much about the interconnection of God, the Word, and Light; all pillars of Masonry.

A prime example of his writing and its commonality with Freemasonry reads, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was with God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. In him was the life; and the life was the light of men. And the light shineth in darkness; and darkness comprehended it not."

St. John the Evangelist is thought to be the most loyal disciple to Jesus. He wrote much on the importance of brotherly love and Fellowship. So who started the feast in his honor (or the other St. John for that matter)? Scholars' debate where the tradition originates, but it is believed it may likely come from the Knights Templar, who held St. John with greater admiration than other namely Saints of the Catholic Church, Peter and Paul. When the Catholic Church tried to remove the Templars (along with their wealth and influence), the Knights Hospitallers (actually called the Knights of St. John) took in property of the Knights Templar and, many Templars became Hospitallers. Even before they joined, a common thread between the two groups was their reverence for the Saints Johns. In 1737, it was written that the close relationship between the Hospitallers and Freemasons resulted in many Hospitallers becoming Freemasons.

When the first St. John's Day feast truly took place, we will never know. What we do know is that the feast of the Evangelist is an important event in Freemasonry, and is celebrated every December 27th – the beginning of the Masonic year. It is on that day newly elected officers begin their term. While often not on December 27th, our feast serves as an occasion to honor those who have served our Lodges for the previous year, and to celebrate the newly elected lodge officers.

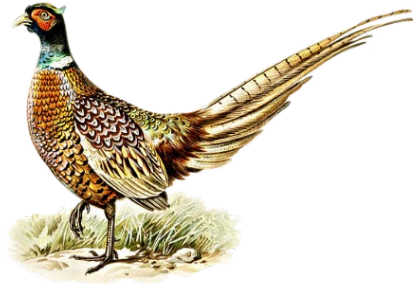

Acacia Lodge has been busy as the year-end approaches.

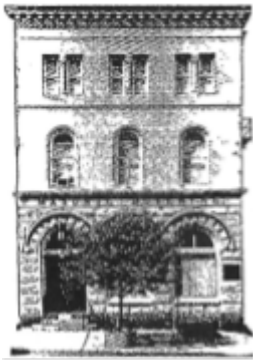
Raising new members to the Master Mason Degree, and updating our website to be both inviting and accessible for anyone looking to become a Mason to get the information they need.

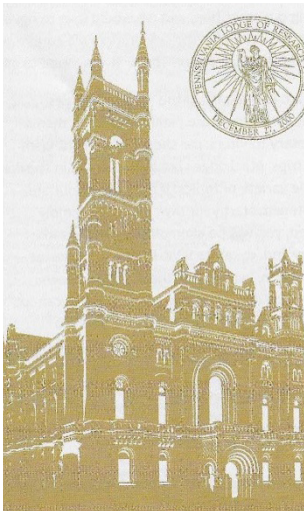
